Target 2023: 34% (15/44) of Year 5 students will achieve HB in NAPLAN Writing Maintain 26% of Year 5 students who achieved in the HB as per their moderated A-E writing grades in 2022. Target 2024: Maintain ___% of Year 6 students who achieved in the HB as per their moderated A-E writing grades in 2023.</p>	<p>If we effectively provide positively framed constructive feedback to students, by developing a feedback cycle that provides timely and individualised feedback, then we will maintain and increase the number of students exceeding year level writing standard (A-E Grades) and in the higher bands in NAPLAN writing.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students will be supported in setting co-constructed writing goals that are specific, achievable and measurable. - Students will be able to thoroughly articulate their current level, how their progress toward achieving their goals is going and what their next steps for writing will be. - Students will be able to understand and act upon feedback provided by the teacher. - An increased number of students will create imaginative, informative and persuasive texts for different purposes and audiences, that exceed year level standard. - Student bookwork shows and increased understanding of writing mechanics, grammatical concepts and sentence types.
<p>Goal 2: To maintain and increase the number of students achieving within the higher bands in reading.</p>	<p>Achievement towards Goal in 2022: Target: 36/47 students (75%) enrolled in Year 3 (2022) will achieve in the higher bands in NAPLAN. 2022 Outcome: 18/46 (41%) Year 3 students achieved in the higher bands in NAPLAN. Target 2023: 20/44 Year 4 students (45%) will achieve a scale score of 120 or above in PAT-R. Target 2024: Target: 22/44 Year 5 students (50%) will achieve in the higher bands in NAPLAN.</p>	<p>If we build teacher capacity by embedding a common pedagogical approach to explicitly teach reading and comprehension strategies with a particular focus on whole class instruction, guided reading and quality independent tasks, we will increase students achieving in the higher bands in NAPLAN reading and PAT-R.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students will be able to articulate and better answer comprehension questions in their running records. - Students will demonstrate improvement by moving a minimum of 3 running record levels by the end of the year. - Students book work will show learning engagement in lessons explicitly teaching a range of comprehension strategies. - Students will maintain (SEA and above) or improve their achievement from previous years in PAT-R and NAPLAN Reading. - Students fluently read a variety of texts that include varied sentence structures and unfamiliar vocabulary, monitored closely throughout their participation in guided reading. - When we review student learning we will see/hear: - Students displaying an in-depth understanding of number concepts and they are able to transfer this number knowledge into other concepts in maths. - Students being able to accurately explain their reasoning while solving complex number problems. - Students can confidently count to and from 1000 and group, partition and rearrange collections of up to 1000. - Students are able to apply their trusting the count, place value and multiplicative thinking knowledge when answering questions and solving problems with the four operations.
<p>Goal 3: To increase student achievement in Mathematics (R-6), with a particular focus on the number strand.</p>	<p>Achievement towards Goal in 2022: Target: 70% (50/72 students) of students enrolled in Year 1 (2022) will answer 70% of the number questions correctly in PAT-M. 2022 Outcome: 32/69 (47%) of students in Year 1 answered 70% of the number questions correctly in PAT-M. Target 2023: 50% (34/68 students) of Year 2 students (2022, Year 1s) will answer 65% of the number questions correctly in PAT-M. Target 2024: 50% (34/68 students) of Year 3 students (2022, Year 1s) will answer 70% of the number questions correctly in PAT-M.</p>	<p>If we implement and embed a feedback process for mathematics that enables students to receive specific, timely and targeted feedback that builds student capacity to understand their data to co-create learning goals and identify next steps in their learning then we will increase the number of students achieving in the Number strand in PAT-M and NAPLAN Numeracy.</p>	<p>(Success criteria for Goal 3 are included in the list above for Goal 2)</p>

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
